## Monday 8 November

The Defamation Bill

### Lord Lester of Herne Hill QC – Blackstone Chambers

Ali Malek QC will look at recent cases dealing with the question of when an English court will take jurisdiction because of concerns about the quality of justice abroad.

## Monday 29 November

Recent developments in disclosure and privilege

### Charles Hollander QC – Brick Court Chambers

Charles Hollander QC will examine a number of recent developments in disclosure and privilege, including disclosure in the Facebook age – e-disclosure and its shortcomings; disclosure from groups of companies; without prejudice – *Oceanbulk Shipping v TMT Asia*; the case for a special privilege for mediation; and privilege in the context of in-house lawyers – *Akzo Nobel*.

## Tuesday 7 December

A new approach to financial regulation: judgement, focus and stability?

### Richard Lissack QC – Outer Temple Chambers

Richard Lissack QC will examine the government's announced new approach to financial regulation, focusing particularly on the proposals for a consolidated Economic Crime Agency. The lecture will consider the opportunities presented by the current financial crisis for a re-shaping of financial regulation and the need for paradigmatic shifts in the philosophies underpinning the investigation and regulation of economic crime to address failures inherent in the current approach.
