Cookies – what are they and how are they used?

Cookies are small files of letters and numbers which the Site sends to your computer or smart phone when you access the Site.

Cookies on the Site

We use the following types of cookies on the Site:

- (1) Essential cookies – without these you will not be able to access the Site. These include status messages and log in information.
- (2) Functional cookies – these relate to improvements to the Site and recognise whether you have, for example, completed parts of the Site which require you to provide information.

- (3) Analytical cookies – these tell us how many visitors we get, how they use the Site and which parts of the Site are visited the most.
- (4) Third party cookies – these relate to links to other sites such as Twitter, Facebook and Youtube which we might embed or link to from the Site. We have no control over cookies from third party sites.
